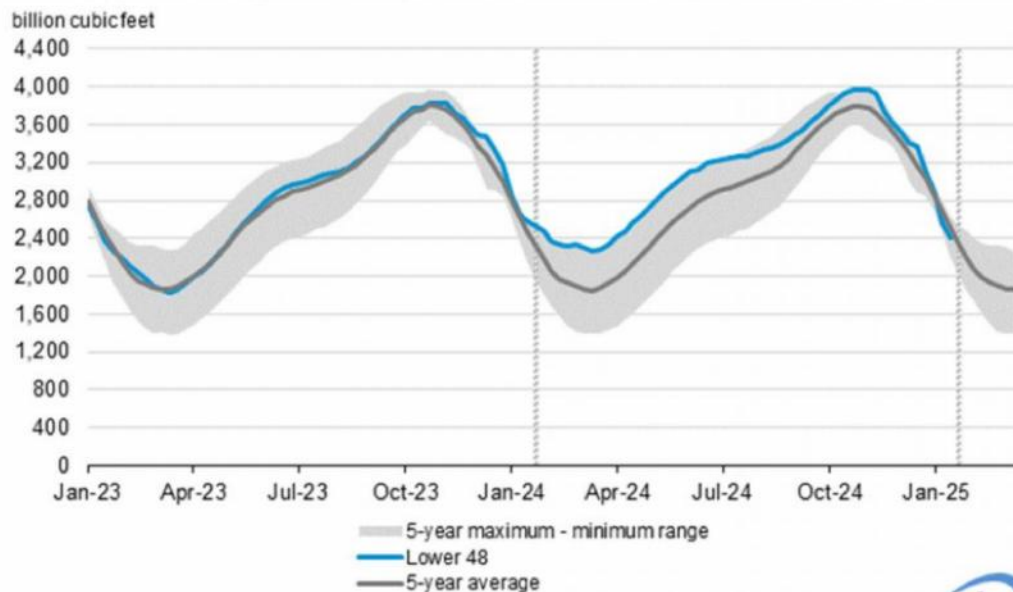

Summary

Working gas in storage was 2,397 Bcf as of Friday, January 31, 2025, according to EIA estimates. This represents a net decrease of 174 Bcf from the previous week. Stocks were 208 Bcf less than last year at this time and 111 Bcf below the five-year average of 2,508 Bcf. At 2,397 Bcf, total working gas is within the five-year historical range.

Prices/Supply/Demand

- **Supply:** According to data from S&P Global Commodity Insights, the average total supply of natural gas rose by 1.6% (1.8 Bcf/d) compared with the previous report week. Dry natural gas production grew by 2.6% (2.6 Bcf/d) to average 106.2 Bcf/d, which is the highest weekly average ever recorded. Average net imports from Canada decreased by 11.7% (0.8 Bcf/d) from last week.
- **Demand:** Total U.S. consumption of natural gas fell by 14.6% (16.1 Bcf/d) compared with the previous report week, according to data from S&P Global Commodity Insights. Natural gas consumed in the residential and commercial sector declined by 22.3% (10.9 Bcf/d) as [warmer weather](#) conditions continued across much of the United States. Natural gas consumed for power generation declined by 11.4% (4.0

Bcf/d), and consumption in the industrial sector decreased by 4.6% (1.2 Bcf/d) week over week. Natural gas deliveries to U.S. LNG export facilities (LNG pipeline receipts) averaged 15.2 Bcf/d, or 1.5 Bcf/d higher than last week.

Pricing:

- **Henry Hub spot price:** The Henry Hub spot price fell 7 cents from \$3.29 per million British thermal units (MMBtu) last Wednesday to \$3.22/MMBtu yesterday.
- **Henry Hub futures price:** The March 2025 NYMEX contract price increased to \$3.360/MMBtu, up 19 cents from last Wednesday to yesterday. The price of the 12-month strip averaging March 2025 through February 2026 futures contracts rose 9 cents to \$3.905/MMBtu.
- **Select regional spot prices:** Natural gas spot prices fell at most locations this report week (Wednesday, January 29, to Wednesday, February 5). Price changes ranged from a decrease of \$3.32 at Algonquin Citygate to an increase of 25 cents at Eastern Gas South.
 - Price changes were mixed in the Northeast this report week. At the Algonquin Citygate, which serves [Boston-area consumers](#), the price fell \$3.32 from \$16.54/MMBtu last Wednesday to \$13.22/MMBtu yesterday. At the Transco Zone 6 NY trading point for New York City, the price increased 24 cents from \$3.57/MMBtu last Wednesday to \$3.81/MMBtu yesterday. Average temperatures in the [Boston Area](#) reached an intraweek high of 36°F on Monday. The Algonquin Citygate price remains elevated this week on seasonal demand for space heating. Natural gas consumption in New England was essentially unchanged at 4.0 billion cubic feet per day (Bcf/d), according to S&P Global Commodity Insights. Since January 24, ongoing repairs west of Transco's compressor station 517 in Columbia, Pennsylvania, on the Leidy Line constrained natural gas deliveries eastbound to the New York and New Jersey region during the report week. The repairs to that segment were completed, and the pipeline [returned to service](#) on February 5.

2025 Price Estimates:

EIA expects the Average price of natural gas to be \$3.10 in 2025 and \$4.00 in 2026.

Avoiding Hazardous Noise

Noise induced hearing loss is a gradual process caused by exposure to hazardous levels of noise. You won't notice any difference from one day to another, but over time it will become harder to hear. Unfortunately, this damage to your hearing is permanent and can affect you not only in the workplace, but at home and in your relationships. You can protect yourself from hazardous noise by buying quieter hand tools for home use, wearing proper hearing protection, avoiding unnecessary time in areas with high noise, and keeping the volume down on your personal listening devices.

Employers can protect their workers by establishing and following a hearing conservation program for noisy areas in their businesses. Components of this program include measuring how loud the noise is, providing medical monitoring for exposed workers, supplying hearing protection, and using the hierarchy of controls to minimize noise as much as possible. IPAA APPLAUDS SENATE PASSAGE OF CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW ACT RESOLUTION TO NULLIFY BIDEN METHANE TAX REGULATIONS

WASHINGTON – The Independent Petroleum Association of America (IPAA) issued the following statement following the Senate passage of [H.J.Res.35](#) which through the Congressional Review Act process disapproves of the Biden Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) methane emissions fee on oil and natural gas facilities which will lead to higher prices for consumers, reduced domestic energy production, and increased American reliance on foreign energy sources.

IPAA President & CEO Jeff Eshelman: "The Independent Petroleum Association of America (IPAA) applauds Sen. John Hoeven for his leadership in overturning the EPA's Waste Emissions Charge (Methane Tax) regulations. This Congressional Review Act (CRA) resolution approved by the Senate today allows Congress to nullify the regulations the Biden Administration established to implement the misguided methane tax. The Biden Administration and Democrats in Congress passed the methane tax to single out and punish the oil and natural gas industry despite its already burdensome EPA regulatory framework. The tax was passed without appropriate understanding of its impact or industry safeguards. IPAA has always opposed the methane tax and believe it is simply a tax designed to hamper American oil and gas production. With the passage of H.J.Res.35 in both the House and Senate, IPAA urges quick action by President Trump to sign this resolution and will work with his Administration to eliminate this unnecessary tax on American oil and natural gas producers as soon as possible."

IPAA also supports [legislation](#) led by Senator Ted Cruz (R-TX) and Congressman August Pfluger (R-TX-11) to repeal the Methane Tax.



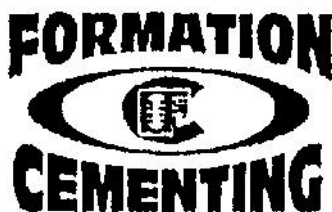
